This Month's Programs

1. Fast-Scan Low-Cost Amateur Digital Television

Program: This program is an excellent video recording of the presentation given at the 2016 ARRL / TAPR Digital Communications Conference in St. Petersburg, Florida last September. Mel Whitten, K0PFX walks through (in a non-technical way) what is required to operate digital fast-scan television, equipment setups, what kind of performance he is achieving, and a list of low-cost equipment supplies that make it easy for many hams to get on the air. The performance and range of digital Amateur TV (ATV) signals is significantly better than analog ATV according to Mel's on-the-air experience.

Biography: Mel Whitten, K0PFX operates HF, VHF, and UHF in St. Louis, Missouri. He has been instrumental in putting one of the first digital HF voice stations on the air, and is currently using digital fast-scan television based on DVB-S. He has previously published in QST magazine on various HF digital formats.

Amateur Radio Continues Growth

Amateur Radio license counts have continued growing in 2016 according to ARRL Volunteer Examiner Coordinator (VEC) Manager Maria Somma, AB1FM.

2016 licenses issued were up 1% over 2015.

- 32,552 were granted in 2016
- 32,077 were granted in 2015
- 33,241 were granted in 2014

The total number of US Amateur Radio licensees has continued to grow each year since the FCC eliminated the Morse code exam requirement in 2007. The net number of Amateur Radio licensees has risen by nearly 87,000 according to Joe Speroni, AH0A.

As of December 31, 2016, the total number of licensees in the FCC database was 742,787. There were:

- 143,337 Amateur Extra
- 45,071 Advanced
- 172,807 General
- 371,560 Technician
- 10,012 Novice licensees.

The FCC no longer issues Advanced or Novice class licenses.

piHPSDR

John Melton, GOORX/N6LYT has announced an initial release of piHPSDR. It's an open-source software package that runs on the Raspberry Pi 3 and allows the PI plus a display screen, buttons, and rotary encoder to serve as a remote display and control unit for the HPSDR (High Performance SDR) series of radios. Those include Mercury, Metis, etc., Hermes, all produced by TAPR, and the ANAN series of radios. Apache Labs apparently has plans to sell the hardware unit, or you can make your own.

John says that if you run two receivers, each at 192,000 samples per second, the CPU on the R-PI-3 gets warm and should have a heatsink installed.

The functionality is somewhat analogous to the Flex Radio Maestro units.
