Other matters in the business meeting:

The liability insurance payment is due in December 2016 for the 2017 year. Discussion was had whether to keep the current policy with Mercer or change to that currently available through the ARRL. That through the ARRL is significantly less expensive with (apparently) equivalent coverage. Service through Mercer has always been top notch with paperwork for Field Day always coming back quickly. A motion was made for the club leadership to analyze and make an appropriate decision.

Treasurer's report: current account balance \$4553.11 It was noted that a significant portion of the club account balance is attributable to the Ed Vaughn estate items donated earlier this year and sold at the August swapmeet.

After a coffee and eyeball QSO break, the main presentation was given by Bob Deuel K2GLO on the history of radio, commercial, military and amateur, especially in southern Oregon. Items of note from the presentation are:

The Marconi experiments were probably at 800-850m wavelength and the only message was a single 'S'.

Spark transmissions were apparently optimal between 300 and 6000m wavelength (1 MHz down to 50 kHz!)

Very early on, ship to shore standardized on 300m and 600m (1000 kHz and 500 kHz) Amateur radio almost didn't come back after WW1.

The nickname 'ham' apparently comes from telegrapher lingo describing a poor telegrapher (unskilled and unprofessional).

The development of the Audion (triode!) and of developing an oscillator lead to voice broadcast radio.

Broadcast radio began with KDKA at 50W (!) in Pittsburgh PA.

The first broadcast station in the Rogue Valley was KFAY in Ashland (August 1922). After various power, location, and other changes, KFAY sputtered out and the equipment was given by Mr. Ruhl to Mr. Virgin. He set up the first KMED transmitter at 50W in the Sparta building (corner of East Main and Riverside).

While there were amateurs in the valley well before then, 1936 marks the first documented amateur radio club in the valley. The Ashland Radio Club had 70 members in that year and also a club was started that same year in Medford to support the Ashland club in preparations for a state-wide amateur radio convention held in Ashland in 1937.

Early Field Day operations were held often on Roxy Ann peak.

Bob's presentation was enjoyed by all.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:45. The next meeting will be a Saturday tour of the Rogue Valley Manor radio facilities.

**Program:** Have you ever wondered about the ham radio facilities available at the Manor? Here is your invitation to visit the Rogue Valley Manor.

The Rogue Valley Manor Amateur Radio Club members extend this invitation to you to tour the ham radio facilities at one of the finest Continuing Care Retirement Communities in the nation.

We'll meet on Saturday, December 3, 2016 in the RVM's Terrace Building (1250 Mira Mar Avenue, Medford) at 2 PM. Refreshments will be served in the Sunrise Room on the 2nd floor during a short introduction about the Rogue Valley Manor. We'll tour the Terrace Radio Room, the Manor's 9th floor Radio Room, visit the rooftop patio for a grand view of the valley and the Manor's antenna farm. We will be in the Terrace Lobby to greet you starting at 1:45 PM on the 3rd. Tours should be completed by 4 PM.

K7RVM and KG7FOJ provide the following operations on campus: D-Star (Full Stack) repeater, Yaesu Fusion VHF/UHF C4FM/FM repeater, FM repeaters on 144.700Mhz and 444.450 Mhz (PL123), IRLP, APRS, RMS Gateway, Echolink, a new Emergency Communications Center in the Terrace Building equipped with D-Star equipment including two ICOM 880h UHF/VHF radios, an ICOM 7100 and an ICOM ID-1D radio with dedicated antennas on the building roof. There are five operating positions in this room. There is a six-operating station radio room on the 9th floor of the Main Manor with twelve dedicated antennas on the building roof. These antennas include two Tri-Band beams, GAP All-Band vertical and a yet to be installed Cushcraft R-9 vertical. See map next page.
